On-Campus Housing

Rainy Hall is:

- Tobacco free
- Alcohol free
- Walking distance to campus, shopping, entertainment, and health care services

Scheduled weekly activities are available for residents of Rainy Hall.

Costs for 2010-2011 Per academic year:

\$2800 per person for a shared bedroom plus a required \$400 meal-plan per semester

\$4120 per person for a private bedroom plus a required \$400 meal-plan per semester

Meals are not served evenings or weekends.

A signed housing contract with a \$200 pre-payment must be submitted before a room assignment is made.



What's included:

- Bedroom with two extra-long twin beds, two dressers, closet, and a desk with chair
- Living room with a sofa, chair, end tables, a coffee table, dining table with 4 chairs, and a desk
- Kitchen with stove, fridge, and dishwasher
- Electricity, heat, water, sewer, garbage, cable, and wireless internet service
- Parking spaces next to the building with a limited number of electrical outlets
- Coin-operated laundry facility on the first floor
- Game room on first floor with pool table, a 52" TV, and a dual TV gaming station
- Locked mailbox for each apartment
- Volleyball and basketball courts, a bicycle trail, and lighted cross-country ski trails
- Study area with computers and access to campus network, files and resources

What to bring:
